GENERAL INFORMATION

Nearly thirty years ago, the Ann Arbor Hands-On Museum first opened its doors of discovery in the old brick firehouse in downtown Ann Arbor. Since 1982, the Museum has expanded in size and standing, leaving its handprint on the community. This was made possible through the generosity of a variety of donors.

After receiving a Kresge Foundation Challenge Grant in 1986, the Museum was able to expand to the third and fourth floors of the firehouse. In 1993 the Museum initiated a \$6.5 million Capital Campaign fund, allowing the Museum to expand by purchasing adjoining buildings and introducing new programs. Those renovations were finished in October 1999. In 2004, *Growing at the Speed of Science* capital campaign raised \$1 million for Museum facilities. In 2007, the Legacy Project provided additional gifts that expanded the Preschool Gallery, opened the Legacy Gallery and gave us new classroom space.

EXHIBITS

In its first year in 1982, the Museum showcased 25 exhibits. Support from generous local business, individual sponsors and grants from the National Science Foundation promoted exhibit development. The Museum is now home to more than 250 interactive exhibits designed to promote science literacy and discovery.

- ✿ Figure out *How Things Work* in the new *Legacy Gallery*
- ✿ Encircle yourself in a bubble and scale a rock climbing wall in the *World Around You*
- ✿ Capture your shadow or create a symphony with a stringless harp in *DTE Energy Foundation Light and Optics Gallery*
- ✿ Move your feet to the beat in front of an interactive screen in *Recollections*
- ✿ Make a splash at the water table in the *Preschool Gallery*, designed for children under 4
- ✿ Explore an authentic Huron Valley Ambulance in the *All About You* gallery
- ✿ Stroll through woods and wildlife in *Michigan Nature*, including a soundscape and interactive nature wall
- ✿ Return to the 1920s in the *Lyons' Country Store Exhibit* complete with historic radio broadcasts, antique toys and cash register

PROGRAMS

The Museum also offers additional programming to highlight spellbinding science.

- ✿ Field Trips and ScienceWorks Lab—a 50-minute lab class to enhance your field trip
- ✿ Sciencepalooza—a science festival held one weekend of every month
- ✿ Outreach Programs—our hands-on science visits your hometown for workshops or family nights!
- ✿ Special Events—unique annual events like the Big Freeze and The Bubble Festival
- ✿ Scout Programs—scouts participate in Camp-Ins and Hands-On Workshops to earn badges
- ✿ Distance Learning—students participate in a workshop live from their classrooms with our staff via videoconferencing
- ✿ Birthday Parties—hands-on celebrations make your day special!
